WHY DOES JESUS JUDGE?

Because He is good & loves righteous acts
Psa 11:7

To bring an end to injustice - Rev 21:4

To restore the whole world - Rev 21:5

To fulfill His purpose, do His will, and
carry out His plans - Isa 46:10-11

First, read each verse; then pray it. You can write your prayer on the lines under each Bible verse on the next page. You can also find other Scriptures that tell us why Jesus judges, and use those instead of the ones we have chosen here.

Remember that when we pray Bible verses:

- We thank the Lord for the truth He is speaking.
- We agree with His words.
- We ask Him for the verse to bear fruit or come to pass in our lives.
